

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF NATCHITOCHEs,
STATE OF LOUISIANA, TAKEN A REGULAR MEETING HELD, MONDAY,**

March 15, 2010

5:00 P. M.

The Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, met in regular and legal session in the Police Jury Board Room of the Natchitoches Parish Courthouse, on Monday, March 15, 2010 at five o'clock (5:00) p.m.

The Invocation was given by Juror Gerald Longlois, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Juror Chris Paige.

There were present: The Honorable Fred Jacobs, President, Police Jurors: Gerald Longlois, Chris Paige, J. D. Garrett, William Hymes, Charles Huggins, Tom Collier, Jessie Hoffpauir and Mimi Stoker.

There were absent: David Dollar and Johnny Martin.

The Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches was then convened as the governing authority of said parish by the President who stated that the Police Jury was ready for the transaction of business.

President Jacobs then asked if Mrs. Martha Carter, Caddo Communications was present. Since she was not, he then recognized the next visitor Mr. Truett A. Irvin. Before allowing Mr. Irvin to speak, President Jacobs told the Jury that he had talked to Mr. George Minturn who told him that the Jury should take no action and send the matter back to the Planning Commission. President Jacobs then recognized Mrs. Corrine Young, Planning Director, who stated that Mr. Minturn was the Chairman of the Planning Commission and he was not present at the meeting when the matter was discussed. She stated that in the meeting there was some controversy with some of the property owners concerning the re-opening of the nightclub. Mrs. Young then stated that after explaining the situation with the Chairman of what happened he told her that no action should be taken because the matter was neither approved or denied and could be brought up at the April 5th meeting. Mr. Paige stated that since the people were here, he would like to hear what they had to say. Mr. Hymes stated that he did not think they should hear the matter since the Jury was not going to vote and it was going back to the Planning Commission. President Jacobs then recognized Mr. Truett Irvin who stated that the only thing he wanted to do was to get a piece of property rezoned for commercial use. Mr. Irvin stated that the owner of the property closed the business due to health problems two years ago and he was trying to get it rezoned.

President Jacobs then stated that the next visitor was Mr. Ralph Ingram. Mr. Kurt Nixon, Engineer with Coyle Engineering Company, then step forward and told the Jury that his firm had done a study on behalf of Mr. Ralph Ingram to determine what the BFE was in the location. After surveying the BFE was a little lower than what was adopted in 1995. Mrs. Young stated that back in 1995, When Mr. Ingram was developing the first couple of phases of his subdivision, he came before the Jury to ask for a BFE because that location never had a rating. At that time, the Jury adopted a BFE of 109 and now they want to lower it to a 108. Mrs. Young went on to tell the Jury that the community has a right to establish a BFE in a zone because the A zone was never determined by the Corp or Engineers or FEMA. Mrs. Young also told the Jury that FEMA never actually said yes Natchitoches Parish can have BFE of 109. So the community used what the engineering firm had determined back in 1995. She said with the new information they want to lower it and make it a 108 and that is the choice the community can make. She also stated that this information has now been sent to FEMA and they will be looking at it for the new Maps that are going to come out in the next Year or so. Mrs. Young stated that she did not know how long it was going to take FEM and if they do establish anything the effect will probably not be that much, because again that is a class a zone that FEMA has never recognized. She then concluded by stating that she did not think that FEMA was going to come back and say that it would not work because they do not have anything to go by.

President Jacobs then recognized Mr. Paige who stated that for the last 3 months, he has been in contact with Mrs. Martha Carter to recreate the 911 Board for the future. He stated that he did not know if he hurt anyone but he was talking about long range planning and his personal take is that no elective officials should serve on the board. Mr. Paige went on to say that he thought the Jury need to restructure the board. Some people say we need to go to the legislative but it is the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury responsibility to appoint the 911 commission members. And with that he knew the Jury should have the mind to include everyone in the Parish. He also stated that they had a break down in time 3 years ago. Mr. Paige then told the Jury that Caddo Parish has a wonderful building and all jurors should take the opportunity to go and see what Caddo have to offer up there for 911.

President Jacobs then stated that Mrs. Martha Carter had just come in and he would recognize her at this time. Mrs. Carter told the Jury in preparation of the meeting tonight she had sent Mrs. Hamilton a copy of different ordinances that created the 911 board in Caddo Parish. She stated that the very first ordinances she sent was about the creation of the communication District. She stated this ordinance basically created the board and has been amended 3 times and all relating to board members. Mrs. Carter then stated that she was not here to make a recommendation to this body but was here to tell the Jury how they created the board in Caddo Parish. She stated that when their board was created it was just 7 board members and it did not say anything about officials, employees, private citizens,

it just said 7 board members. It only referenced whether they were inside the city limits or not. Mrs. Carter then told the Jury that the first ordinance stated that 5 members be appointed from City of Shreveport, two members that was in the Parish and one appointed by the Sheriff. Four years later, she stated that the ordinance was amended to board members in which five (5) members inside the City of Shreveport and two (2) members outside, they would be all private citizens and there would be no public officials. The 3rd ordinance change dealt with house keeping issues. The 4th amendment was made most recent, in 2005, and dealt with the sheriff wanting a specific board member to nominate and the Parish Commission would have final confirmation. As of right now Caddo has seven board members, with 4 members that are nominated by the City of Shreveport, one that is nominated by the Sheriff and two are nominated by the Parish Commission and all seven are confirmed but the Parish Commission. Mrs. Carter also stated that when Mr. Paige visited her center they talked about all the infighting among the police, fire, and sheriff departments back in 1989. She stated that the Parish Commission basically said in order for them to move forward they had to make a change with the members. They had to figure out how to have a private citizen involved in a public safety emergency board.

President Jacobs then recognized Mrs. Theresa Gibson, Executive Director of the Natchitoches Parish Housing Authority, who asked the Jury to reappoint Mr. Ed Ward to their board. She stated Mr. Ward has served the Board well by always being there and always ready to lend a helping hand. Mrs. Gibson then stated that she had one more thing she wanted to ask the Jury. She stated she knew the Jury owned the old Library building in Robeline that was sitting there empty. She then asked the Jury for permission to use the building for the Robeline Heritage Festival to store their cookbooks, t-shirts and other stuff.

On motion by Mr. Paige, duly seconded by Mr. Longlois, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby adopt the minutes of the Work Session/Regular meeting held Monday, February 22, 2010.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Hymes, duly seconded by Mr. Collier, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby send back to the Parish Planning Commission the decision of approving or denying an application submitted by Mr. Truett A. Irvin to rezone a 2.00 acre tract of land located in Section 5, T12N, R6W from I-A to B-3 to operate a night club on Highway 479, due to the Natchitoches Parish Planning Commission taking no Action on the matter.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Hoffpauir, duly seconded by Mr. Paige, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby conduct a public hearing to hear any and all comments or objections relative to adopting an Animal Ordinance for the Parish of Natchitoches.

Motion Carried

President Jacobs then declared the Public Hearing open.

He then recognized Mrs. Carolyn Breedlove with the Hope for Paws Group, who stated that she was speaking on behalf of the Natchitoches Paws Groups. Mrs. Breedlove stated that she would like to thank the Police Jury and all involved for bringing this to the point of being adopted. She stated that in the beginning of Article 3, the definitions on page 4 of this section, Item number T, the definition of a dangerous dog is defined in great detail in part one and then in Part two says any dog. Mrs. Stoker then told Mrs. Breedlove that Item Number T continues on the next page. She then thanked Mrs. Stoker and said she had no further comments.

President Jacobs then asked if there were any more comments or objections. Relative to this, the following action was taken:

On motion by Mr. Hoffpauir, duly seconded by Mr. Paige, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby closed the public hearing relative to adopting an Animal Ordinance for the Parish of Natchitoches.

On motion by Mr. Hymes, duly seconded by Mr. Garrett, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby adopt an Animal Ordinance for the Parish of Natchitoches.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Paige, duly seconded by Mr. Longlois, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby table until next month changing the Base Flood Elevation (BFE) of 109.0 feet for the Southwood Estates Subdivision.

Motion Carried

President Jacobs then recognized Mrs. Harris who presented the report of the Office of Community Services/Head Start Program for the month of February. Mrs. Harris then told the Jury that she was doing her report for February 1st through the 28, 2010. She stated the CSBG program was not doing anything right now. Mrs. Harris then stated that the food for senior's serves 237 individuals and 215 households were served commodities. She also stated that the food and shelter program ended December 31st of 2009 and they have not received any funding for that program. Ms. Harris also stated that the energy assistant program received a second allocation from the Department of Health and Human Services on the 17th of February. She went on to say that for the regular service for energy, they had received \$434,380.51 to pay on utility bill.

President Jacobs then recognized Ms. Miley, Parish Treasurer, who gave a financial report of the Jury.

Ms. Miley told the Jury that as of March 15th, the Detention Center had 110 inmates, Ware Youth Center had 4, Richland 1 and Avoyelles had 4. She stated that the current bill is \$44,026.18 and she had not paid it yet. Ms. Miley also stated that she had sent the bill to the District Attorney to make sure everything is ok. She then stated that she had just sent it to him so he has it to check and when she got it back it will have to pay a total of \$89,308.39 for two months. Ms. Miley then stated that this amount was going to run into a problem because it is double what she had budgeted for. She then stated that the coroner expense is \$41,305.00 and has \$15,394.00 outstanding. She went on to say she had \$70,000 budgeted for the Coroner.

On motion by Mr. Longlois, duly seconded by Coach Garrett, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby accept the report of the Treasurer.

President Jacobs then recognized Mrs. Hamilton, Purchasing Agent, who presented the bid tabulation on bids received Wednesday, March 3, 2010 for cold mix asphalt, an excavator and a new or used dump truck:

Relative to this, the following action was taken:

On motion by Mr. Paige, duly seconded by Coach Garrett, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby award the bids received for a used excavator to the low bidder, Doggett Machinery of Shreveport, Louisiana, in the amount of \$63,500.00.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Paige, duly seconded by Mr. Longlois, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby award the bids received for cold mix asphalt to the low bidder, Diamond B. Construction of Alexandria, for pickup from the plant, in the amount of \$87.00 per ton.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Longlois, duly seconded by Mr. Collier, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby award the bid for one (1) used 7 cubic yard dump truck to the low bidder Service Chevrolet of Lafayette, Louisiana in the amount of \$56,670.91.

Motion Carried

President Jacobs then stated that the next item on the agenda was to discuss the Old Courthouse Museum. He recognized the Parish Administrator who told the Jury that she had received a letter from the Cane River National Heritage Area who was interested in renting the Old Courthouse. She stated that the Jury was receiving \$800 for rent from the State with utilities included. Mrs. Hamilton also stated that the District Attorney went over and looked and was not sure if he wanted the building or not. She stated if they moved in the Jury would not get anything. Mrs. Hamilton also stated that the Cane River National Heritage would be willing to pay \$1,200.00 per month with utilities included.

President Jacobs then recognized Mr. Hoffpauir who stated that the Jury would pay more than that on electricity in a month. Mr. Longlois then stated that the Cane River National Heritage Area would have the capability to put money in the building. He stated that they could get grants to fix up the building like it needs to be.

President Jacobs then recognized Mrs. Melinda Reliford, Acting Director, of the State Museum who stated that she just want to say that they were not paying anything over \$400 a month when Carolyn Harrington was the director. She stated that later they started paying the \$800 a month. Mrs. Reliford also stated that there are some things to consider such as the building need a lot of fixing that the Jury could not afford and the air conditioning is a problem. She then stated that when you are talking about asking for more rent you must consider that during the summertime it is very hot.

She also stated that they had to shut down a lot of days and go home because they could not work. She went on to say that it is expensive for the Jury to go out and buy an air condition and she thought that basically they should be happy with what they get because no one is going to pay \$1200.00 plus a really high electric bill. Mrs. Melinda concluded her remarks by telling the Jury it was going to cost a lot more to install an air conditioner to fix the first floor area for cooling.

President Jacobs then recognized Mr. Hoffpauir who stated that the letter stated \$1,000.00 and even if they went to \$1,200.00 the utilities were included in the amount. He asked if they were not going to pay their own electric bill? Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that the Jury was going to pay \$1,000.00 a month for utilities and it would be better to unplug it. He then asked how much does an electric bill run over there? It was then stated that it was no way of knowing because all of the buildings are connected together. Mr. Hoffpauir told the Jury they would be better off if we got it separated to see what we paid. He then stated that the Jury would come out better if the electric was redone and they paid the electric bill plus \$1200.00.

President Jacobs then stated that the next item on the agenda was to discuss the resolution received from the Natchitoches Parish Communications District Board.

President Jacobs then recognized Mr. Paige who told the Jury that he thought the Jury should write a letter saying we are looking into other options and did not need the resolution.

Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that the Jury should look into this because they got permission to have a nine man commission and we should say we are going to have a nine man commission regardless. He stated that the Jury could make the qualification on a later date. Mr. Hoffpauir also stated that the Jury can say ok you have a nine man commission we are going to put the sheriff on there, we are going to have public officials and it do not matter where you come from, in town or out of town. He then stated put the sheriff, four people from inside the city limit and four people from outside the city limit. Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that no one from Caddo Parish should be on that board. They have the ambulance director and he is not from Natchitoches Parish.

Mr. Paige then asked, why don't we ask for the Sheriff's appointee rather than the sheriff himself? He also stated that right now what happen in the last meeting was that they moved Mrs. Laquita off the board. Mr. Paige said the Jury needs to look at this and as Mrs. Martha said that the board changes over time. He went on to say that the 911 have 1.5 million dollar in that budget and various departments would like to keep control over what goes on with that 1.5 million dollars and that is what is going on here.

Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that he thought the only people that are serving legal on the board are the Police Jury representation because the other have not been re-elected, they have not been appointed by this board. He also stated that some of those people have never been before this board. They should have to be appointed and the Jury should go according to the law and the law says they have to be reappointed and they should have to be appointed.

Mr. Paige then stated that even if the Sheriff would have wanted this lady on there it should have come to us. To say that we are making a change and would the Jury please accept this person he wants on there, that is what should have happen. Mr. Paige also stated that they are supposed to look at putting sirens out in the parish and the lady from Natchez came and asked about putting them out in Natchez and was told to her they could not put them out there because there was no school, that is not right. He went on to say they put them in the City of Natchitoches and around Northwestern. Mr. Paige stated that he talked with Mr. McCain who told him to talk with the various people. He talked with CLECO and with VEMCO. They were lined up and wanted to come but 911 never had another meeting on that issue. That has been 4 months now and it is unfair to the people in the parish. Mr. Paige also stated that you look at the growth of this Parish and I would say it is headed out toward the bypass and out toward the Natchez area and down where Mr. Fred lives out there. He stated that you have a lot of people building out there and even if they put one or two a year it is better than none.

Mrs. Stoker stated that when you look at the budget and 50% of the people live outside of the city limits, the most of the money is being spend in the city and everyone in the Parish is paying this tax so everyone should be receiving benefits from it. Mrs. Stoker then stated that she thought it has a lot to do with the make up of the board; Mr. Fred is in the Parish, Victor live in the Parish, as far as I know that is it.

Mr. Paige then stated that in all fairness if the Board, if it was planned another way to where the parish is getting what the City is, he would be standing for it; I am just talking about fairness. He then stated they have a problem here to where we set in that meeting, they had this sheet out showing about the signs and the chairperson said he has a problem with it. The Board did not buy the signs for the City and then they get a break down of \$7,000.00 worth of signs that had been bought. Mr. Paige then stated that the purchase of the signs was over a three-year period. He stated that he was sitting there thinking 911 had spent \$7,000.00 worth of signs in one year, that is unfair especially when enough people were there to vote to make sure they kept buying the signs for those people. Mr. Paige also stated that when the ambulance service goes out in Marthaville and your sign is missing they could not find you. Now if you jurors want to be quiet about this, this is a serious problem.

Mrs. Stoker then stated that she thought the first thing we need to do is send a letter to the Sheriff, 911 President or whoever, to say that if a person has not been approved to serve on the 911 board by the Jury, please have them to appear at the April's Meeting.

Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that the Jury should also say that we are going to appoint so many from in town and so many from out in the country. Because right now we only have one of the eight not counting, if you use the sheriff as law and then he appointed that person, he is the one that is in charge of the emergency stuff, the FEMA stuff. If you had his appointee then we could have four inside of town and four outside of town in which that may take some of the Jurors off. But right now we only have one and they have the rest of them. Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that what we need to do is send them a letter saying that these and these is not to serve and we are going to have so many to come.

Mrs. Hamilton then told the Jury that in order to change members the Jury must amend the Ordinance.

Mr. Hoffpauir then stated that he thought the resolution was ugly and took offense at this thing. He stated that if you look at number 8 and read it you should take offense at it too. He went on to say that something needs to be done about taking a Police Jury man off. Mr. Hoffpauir also stated that this was their solution and then they will have all of it.

Mr. Hymes told the Jury that his only deal is this, the Police Jury is known as the wacky for tacky. We are guilty of doing stuff without a solid plan. We have not researched it and we do not have all the facts. Mr. Hymes then asked several questions, if the Jury was changing it to make progress; are we spending our wheel; or are we going backward; or are we changing it because we know it need to be changed? He stated that he was not against changing it but he thought the change should be progress. Mr. Hymes said in other words slow down the wagon a little bit, get together and call a 911 meeting specifically. He stated that they were not going to solve nothing with everyone at 9:00 p.m. waiting to get home. He said call a meeting, or set up a meeting, put everything on the table and decide how you want to form the commission. And when the Jury does take a step do not let it be something that people look back and laugh at what the Police Jury did and we loose even more credit. That is my only deal.

Mr. Paige stated that the Jury needs to come up with a format on how we can work with that board. He stated if we are talking about hiring a chairperson to run the 911, everyone in this community know what happens at the schools. Mr. Paige then stated that he wanted this body to work with the present board. We are not having this discussion because they done something wrong, we are talking about the future of 911.

After a lengthy discussion, the following action was taken:

On motion by Mr. Hoffpauir, duly seconded by Mr. Collier, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby add to the agenda starting the process to amend Ordinance #112 by restructuring the 911 Commission.

On motion by Mr. Longlois, duly seconded by Mr. Hoffpauir, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby start the process to amend Ordinance #112 by restructuring the 911 Commission.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Hoffpauir, duly seconded by Mr. Paige, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby start the process to appoint someone to the Natchitoches Parish Planning Commission due to Mr. Fred Terasa resigning and Mr. Merilyn Robinson's term expiring.

On motion by Mr. Hymes, duly seconded by Mr. Paige, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby start the process to appoint someone to the Natchitoches Parish Housing Authority due to Mr. Ed Ward's term expiring.

On motion by Mrs. Stoker, duly seconded by Mr. Hoffpauir, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby start the process to appoint/reappoint someone to the Waterworks District #2 Board of Directors, due to Mr. Edgar Roge's term expiring.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Paige, duly seconded by Mr. Hymes, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby award proposals received for engineering services for the FY 2010/2011 LCDBG Economic Development Application for roadway expansion and levee recertification at Martco's Chopin Industrial Site to Johnson & Pace, Inc, Engineering, Architecture & Surveying of Longview, Texas.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mr. Paige, duly seconded by Mr. Hymes, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby accept the report of the Director of Public Works who reported no emergency expenditures for the period of February 17, 2010 through March 15, 2010.

Motion Carried

On motion by Mrs. Stoker, duly seconded by Mr. Longlois, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby approve expenditures for the period of February 17, 2010 through March 15, 2010 in the amount of \$1,034,909.90.

Motion Carried

President Jacobs then discussed going around the table. He then recognized Mr. Hymes who told the Jury that at the next meeting, and they have a month to think about this, he was going to make a motion that going around the table stops and at the end when the last item is adjourned. He stated that no other Governing body in this Parish goes around the table after a meeting. He told the Jury that anything they wanted on an agenda they put it on the agenda, they discuss it and get up and go home. Mr. Hymes then stated that the worst part about around the table is they end up having a meeting after a meeting. Then the Jury is another hour or so and questions the legality. He then stated that the legality in a meeting is that you must have it on the agenda, it must be advertised in the newspaper and the Jury is discussing things in a legal session that the public has no clue on. Mr. Hymes then stated that he was so tired of all that, it is not even beneficial to the parish at all and it is also not fair to the Jury for the Newspaper Editor, Carolyn Roy, to write in the paper a lot of extra unnecessary stuff.

President Jacobs then stated that they had gone to Lake Charles to the Police Jury Convention and was discussing this with some of the people up there and they said basically the same thing that it is illegal. He said unless we are talking about some thing that is on the agenda, we should not talk about something that is not on the agenda.

President Jacobs then recognized Mr. Collier who stated that he had a resolution from the Town of Campti and he wanted Mrs. Catherine to send it to Mr. Jack McCain. He told the Jury it is about the siren on the streets. Mr. Collier stated that Campti has more schools and churches than any other town in the Parish.

President Jacobs then recognize Mr. Hoffpauir who said that he did not have much to say but when he look at the wall, he remember the days when those people were in these seats. Mr. Hoffpauir said he always thought the Police Jury was someone, but they do not act like someone. One of the reason we are not someone, and he do not care about being someone, is that we talk about stuff and keep talking about it but we do not get anything done. We just talk about doing it and that is as far as it goes. Mr. Hoffpauir then stated is just like the Head Start, we let them come in with a whole herd of people and they come in here and say they were going to have garage sales and other stuff and we are sitting here with our head in a bucket. No one says anything, and we do not do anything. These people have our money and no one is being held accountable for it.

President Jacobs then recognize Mrs. Stoker who stated that she was notified the other day that Natchitoches Parish was eligible for a \$80,000.00 grant from the EPA. She stated that she had the information they requested and called a couple of people who she knew had information, put it together and sent it out. Mrs. Stoker then stated that these grants are a shot in the dark, but she was on one of those list where they send you information they said that Natchitoches Parish was eligible for Level 1 EPA Grant for up to 90,000.00. She then repeated that it was a shot in the dark and she would not be notified until October. Mrs. Stoker also said if the Jury gets the Grant it will be something good for the Parish. She also stated that she have some information on the water systems. She stated that they were told it is illegal for the Parish to go on private property to install a culvert and two Parishes are in a lawsuit because of that right now.

Mr. Longlois stated that the Parish could not even go down any private road or a bus turn around and If we do we are liable for it.

Mrs. Catherine then told the Jury that they were waiting on the report from the review team regarding the Head Start Program. She also stated that there were some changes that need to be done in order to make it work. As far as the Jury giving the program to the School Board, the Jury could not give it to them. The Jury would have to relinquish the agreement and the federal people would decide who gets the program. Mrs. Hamilton then stated that if they give it to the School Board it was a possibility that they would lay off the personnel and the Jury would have to pay for unemployment. She then stated that the Police Jury could not afford to pay for unemployment because the Jury is self-insured and would have to pay it out of General Fund.

Since there was no other business, the following action was taken:

On motion by Mrs. Stoker, duly seconded by Mr. Longlois, that the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury, in regular and legal session convened, does hereby adjourn until the next regular or called meeting of the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury.
